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Montana Contractor Headed to Prison for Not Paying 941 Taxes for Eight Years

Jason Rigoli, the owner of Granite Construction Services, of Peculiar, Montana plead guilty to one count of tax fraud. He did not file any personal, business, or employment tax returns from 2013 to 2020.

Rigoli used his business bank accounts to pay for personal expenses, such as travel, restaurant meals, and liquor. He also paid his employees in cash to avoid payroll taxes. When the IRS executed a search warrant at Granite Construction they found false returns that were not filed with the IRS, with labels such as "Fake/High," and "Real 2014".

In addition, Rigoli applied for two Economic Injury Disaster Loans from the Small Business Administration for the same business but under two different names. He received one loan but was denied the other, which he applied for under a shell company with his parents' address as the business address.

From 2014 to the date of his sentencing, Rigoli had paid only \$139 in federal or state income or employment taxes. His lack of books and records, and because he mostly used cash and comingled funds, the IRS was forced to reconstruct the company's books using bank records and documents recovered from the business. The IRS gave Rigoli the benefit of the doubt, and as a result, the total tax loss was relatively low. Rigoli owes \$138,455 in restitution, and he was sentenced to one-year and one-day in prison.

Employer Floored by Employee's Fraud and 1.8 Million Dollar Theft

Joanne Dinoto pleaded guilty to bank fraud, wire fraud, identity theft and filing a false tax return after stealing more than 1.8 million dollars from her employer, a flooring company in Ohio.

Between 2008 and 2020, Dinoto falsely inflated her salary, used her employer's credit card for personal use, and forged two checks to herself. To hide her scheme, she modified the company's accounting records and did not report any of the embezzled funds on her tax returns.

She faces multiple years in prison, and restitution to her employer and the IRS.

Financial Manager Manages Company's Money to Her Accounts

Mai Houa Xiong, a financial manager from California, pleaded guilty to wire fraud, identity theft and filing a false tax return after embezzling over \$1 million from her employer, a property management company in Minneapolis.

Xiong was the financial manager for the company and had access to the financials, bank accounts, vendor and contract payments and bookkeeping of several Homeowners Associations. From 2015 to 2022 she stole from HOA fees intended for maintenance, construction, and other costs, by disguising electronic transfers to her personal bank accounts as legitimate expenses. She also used her authority as a signatory to make cash withdrawals directly from the HOAs' accounts, including making withdrawals for months after she was fired from her position in July 2021.

After Xiong was fired, she began collecting unemployment benefits, and continued to do so even after she found another job.

Xiong faces several years in prison and restitution to her employer and the IRS.

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Bookkeeper Steals from the Hand that Feeds Her

Carla Burke, the bookkeeper for the Anderson Community School Corporation Food Service Department, was sentenced to 28 months in prison for falsifying tax documents and wire fraud.

Burke was responsible for maintaining the financial records, bank account, and vendor invoices for the Department, and generating payments to vendors. From 2014 to 2019, she issued company checks to herself and then cashed them at her personal bank. She covered her tracks by recording the payee as a vendor, rather than herself, and used the money for her personal use, including gambling.

Burke lied to federal agents when they began investigating her, and did not report \$225,381 in income derived from the stolen checks on five years of tax returns.

The scheme was uncovered during a routine audit by the Indiana State Board of Accounts, when they discovered missing documentation. In total, Burke wrote 312 fraudulent checks to herself totaling \$976,773.29.

In addition to the prison sentence, Burke was ordered to pay \$976,772.39 in restitution to Anderson Community School Corporation and \$141,190 to the IRS.

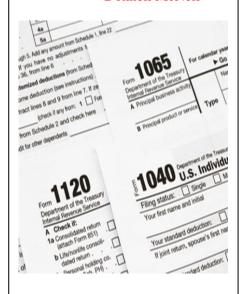
